## **OCTOBER MEETING**

The Nature Conservancy recently announced the opening of an office in Wichita. Janet Studnicka is the Senior Philanthropy Officer for the Kansas Chapter of The Nature Conservancy. Janet will be the Wichita Audubon speaker at the our meeting on October 21, and will present a program called "Conservation By Design." She will discuss recent conservation successes in Kansas and will touch on the global approach and some recent successes in other states and countries. The Nature Conservancy is a leading conservation organization working around the world to protect ecologically important lands and waters for nature and people. Studnicka manages the Conservancy's Wichita office, which opened in October 2007. Previously, she was Associate State Director for the Conservancy's Oklahoma Chapter. With 16 years experience in fundraising and non-profit management, Studnicka's career with the Conservancy began nearly five years ago with the Texas Chapter. She was drawn to The Nature Conservancy because of its mission to protect nature and preserve life through a collaborative, science-driven approach. The program will be on Tuesday, October 21, 7:30 p.m. at the Great Plains Nature Center.

## **BEGINNING BIRD WALKS**

If you are a backyard birdwatcher who would like to expand and learn some of the techniques and tips for finding and identifying birds, these walks are for you. Fifteen people travelled to Elkhart in Southwest Kansas for a weekend of birding on September 13 & 14. We missed all the rain in Wichita and saw lots of good birds and wildflowers. A big thank you to Lawrence & Ruth Smith who were our hosts, and as helpful as they always are when we come to Elkhart.

Some of the best birds included a Magnolia Warbler, a Blackpoll, and a Northern Waterthrush in the Elkhart Cemetery and shelterbelt. Curve-billed Thrashers, Western Tanager, and Scaled Quail at an isolated farmstead in Stanton County, the dependable Lewis's Woodpeckers in Baca County, along with Lesser Goldfinches.
