

This year's extended field trip is a second attempt at the trip we planned last year. Covid made that trip impossible, but we are hoping that this year we can do it safely.

This 3-day trip on March 25 - 27, 2022, will include Lesser Prairie-chicken viewing at a ranch in Gove County. This will involve a fee, but we are eager to encourage and support ranchers who are opening their land up to Prairie-chicken viewing. We will stay at Logan House in historic Russell Springs for two nights. We will also do some sightseeing, visiting Scott State Park, Smoky Valley Ranch, Monument Rocks and Little Jerusalem State Park.

We will be looking for high plains birds including raptors and longspurs. Due to space limitations in the blinds and at Logan House, there is a strict 16 person limit.
